



Dinner Table Difference

- 1. Have one person close their eyes.
- 2. One family member removes something from the table. For example, a napkin, salt shaker, fork, or dinner roll are all great ideas!
- 3. The player opens their eyes and must guess what has been removed from the table.
- 4. If they guess correctly, they get to close their eyes again, and a new round starts with a different family member removing something from the table. If they guess wrong, a new family member closes their eyes, and the game starts over. The first to list the three things wins.



Treasure Hunt

Write sections of the sentence,

"We tell others about Jesus so they will hear and believe the good news," on 8–10 sticky notes and hide them around the house. Create a clue for each sticky note that kids will use to seek out their "treasure." For example, you might choose to hide a sticky note under a chair and use the clue "The sticky note can be found where you sit." After all the sticky notes have been found, combine them to create the sentence above and read it aloud. Remind kids that the greatest treasure we can have is to know and believe in Jesus. Consider awarding kids with candy or other rewards for their treasure-seeking efforts.

Say: Jesus gave His life so we can be saved from sin. We tell others about Jesus so they will hear and believe the good news. We don't want to keep this good news to ourselves. Instead, God commands us to share it with others so they can have the greatest treasure — life with Jesus!
