Community Group Leader Job Description

- 1. Apply to become a Community Group Leader
- 2. Pass a background check
- 3. Attend New Community Group Leader Orientation & Training

Objective(s):

- Lead a Married, Men's or Women's community group (of 12 or less people) for a semester (which simply means a 3-month period)
- **Determine what your group will study for the semester.** The content for your group could be the discussion questions from the Sunday messages that NMC creates, a study from the NMC library on Right Now Media, an approved book or NMCU.
- **Provide logistics for your group to NMC for web promotion.** Each group will be listed on the NMC web page so people can see what open community groups are available to them to choose from.
- Connect with group members and those interested in your group. The logistics for
 your group will be listed on the Groups page of the NMC website. Interested parties will
 be able to contact via email leaders to find out more about the group. The group leader
 is responsible for connecting with the interested parties and their group members. The
 group will remain open until the group leader communicates to the NMC groups team
 that the group is full.
- **Lead your group.** The details and best practices for leading a group can be found in the Community Group Leaders Manual.

• Connect with your Coach

- Every group leader is assigned a coach. The coach's primary role is to pray for you as a leader and to be a resource to you in case you need anything on your leadership journey.
- Attend All Group Leader Trainings (twice a year)
- At the end of semester;
 - Encourage group members to sign up for the next semester of Community Groups.
 - o Consider leading another semester as a group leader.
